Former Lt. Governor and Hundred Club Life Member Joseph J. Fauliso passes at age 98

Hundred Club Life Member Joseph J. Fauliso, age 98 of

Hartford died on August 20, 2014. Joe, as he was known by most, had a career that spanned over 50 years in service to the citizens of Connecticut. His political career began when he was elected Hartford city alderman in 1943. He went on to serve as a judge in the municipal and state courts before being elected to the State Senate in 1966 where he served seven terms, including three as President Pro Tempore.

In 1980 Joe was ready to retire from politics when Gov. Ella T. Grasso asked him to run for a seventh term. Joe was re-elected. Gov. Grasso died later that year. Lt. Gov. William A. O'Neill succeeded Grasso and Joe automatically succeeded O'Neill as Lt. Governor. Joe ran for the office on the O'Neill ticket in 1982 and was elected. He was reelected 1986. He left office with Gov. O'Neill in January 1991 having completed ten years and eight days which made him the longest serving Lt. Governor in state history.

Known for his oratorical skills he was asked to be keynote speaker at several club events. In his address at the 1990 annual meeting, and one of his last public appearances as Lt. Governor, he expressed his feelings for the Club and its work stating, "This organization will always have a special place in my heart. I know of no other organization whose goals are more worthy, whose mission is more heartwarming or whose members are held in higher esteem." It was shortly after that meeting that the Club received a letter from Joe along with a sizable check. The source of the funds were surplus campaign funds which Joe requested the Club use to further its work.

Joe was elevated to Honorary Life Member at the annual banquet in 1991. Then President Peter G. Hill thanked Joe for his support of the Club and his years of public service when he noted "I can think of no one... whose loyalty to and support of our organization has been an inspiration to its officers, directors and the membership."

Joe was born February 23, 1916 in Stonington, Conn. He attended Providence College and obtained his law degree from Boston University.

Joe is survived by his wife Ann to whom he had been married for 39 years. He was predeceased by a son Dr. Richard Fauliso who succumbed to cancer in 1993. He is also survived by two sisters, two granddaughters, a stepdaughter Sharon Bassock and a stepson Scott Schwerdtfeger .

A funeral mass was held at St. Peter Claver Church West Hartford on August 26, 2014. The family requested donations in lieu of flowers be made to the Fidelco Guide Dog Foundation in Farmington or the House Of Bread in Hartford.
