Lt. Bruce M. Bachinsky Waterbury Fire Department

Lt. Bruce M. Bachinsky, age 48, of the Waterbury Fire Department passed away unexpectedly on October 26, 2010. Lt. Bachinsky's death has been determined to be related to his duties as Waterbury firefighter and occurred shortly after returning from fighting a fire in Waterbury. He is survived by his wife Helen (Schlosser) Bachinsky and his two daughters Laura, age 18 who will be enrolling at Central Connecticut State College and Michelle, age 15, currently a student at Holly Cross High School..

Lt. Bachinsky was born in West Hartford July 17, 1963 the son of Roy and Margaret Bachinsky of Beacon Falls. He graduated from Sacred Heart High School and subsequently earned associate's degrees in computer aided drafting/design and manufacturing engineering from Waterbury State Technical College. He subsequently enlisted in the U. S. Army. He completed ranger training and served with the 2nd 75th Ranger Battalion at Fort Lewis, Washington. After completion of his enlistment he continued to serve with the 2nd 102 Infantry Cadre Base in Meriden as a member of the Connecticut National Guard.



Prior to joining the fire service he was employed at the Precision Cut Wire Company in Waterbury.

Lt. Bachinsky joined the Waterbury Fire Department on October 16, 1998. Upon completion of his training he was stationed at Engine Company No. 10.

in June of 2009 he was promoted to Lieutenant and assigned to Engine Company No. 8.

Lt. Bachinsky was active in the community having coached Bunker Hill School girls basketball and softball for many years and enjoyed watching and supporting his daughter's soccer, basketball and softball games.

Besides his wife, children and parents he is survived by his brother, Craig Bachinsky, a sister Daron Gawronski and her husband Jim; a brother-in-law John Schlosser nieces Emma and Diane Gawronski and his best friend Todd Galik.

A funeral with full Waterbury Fire Department honors was conducted October 30, 2010 at Basilica of the Immaculate Conception.
